NOTE: As you'll learn, there are some differences between the 1818 first edition version of *Frankenstein* and the 1831 version, which is why the chapter numbering may be off. I have tried to give you guidelines to help you identify what you have to read.

In the original, the novel begins with four letters from a sea Captain named Robert Walton. In most editions these are called letters, but in some cheaper editions they may be chapters 1-4.
